Your Child's Vaccine Journey: The NHS Schedule At A Glance

This is a helpful guide from the NHS to check the vaccination schedule and when to have them.

It's important that vaccines are given on time for the best protection, but if you or your child missed a vaccine, contact your GP to catch up.







8 Weeks

- 6-in-1 (diphtheria, tetanus, pertussis, polio, Hib, hep B)
- Rotavirus (1st dose)
- MenB (1st dose) protects against meningitis B

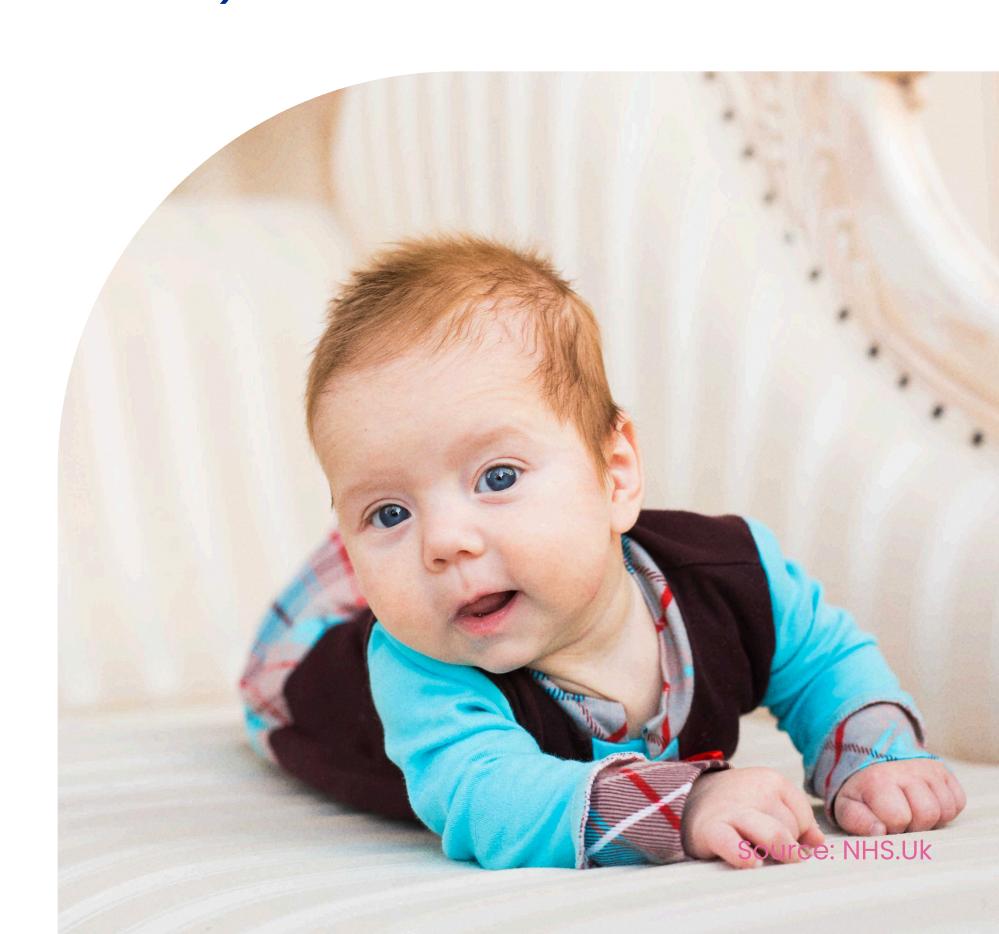






12 Weeks

- 6-in-1 (2nd dose)
- Rotavirus (2nd dose)
- MenB (2nd dose)







16 Weeks

- 6-in-1 (3rd dose)
- Pneumococcal Vaccine protect against serious illnesses like pneumonia, sepsis, and meningitis.

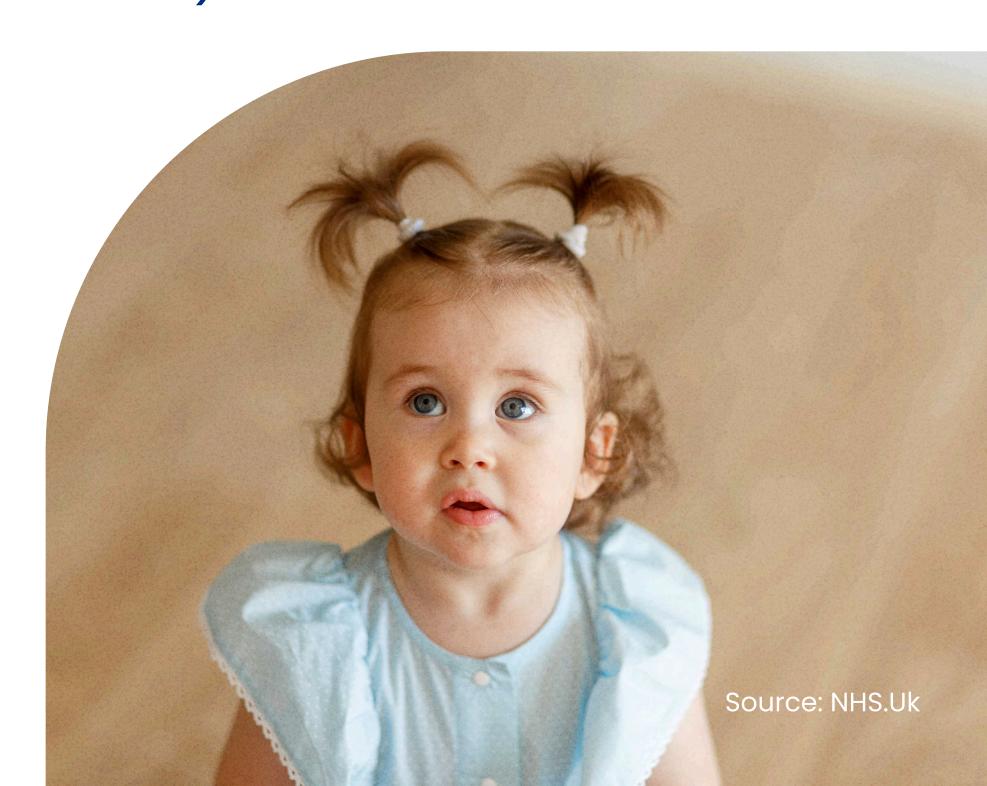






1 Year Old

- Hib/MenC booster (for children born on or before 30 June 2024)
- MMR
- Pneumococcal Vaccine (2nd Dose)
- MenB (3rd Dose)







18 Months

- 6-in-1 booster (4th dose for children born on or after 1 July 2024)
- MMR 2nd dose (2nd dose for children born on or after 1 July 2024)







3 Years 4 Months (Or Soon After)

- MMR booster (2nd dose for children born on or before 30 June 2024)
- 4-in-1 Pre-school booster (diphtheria, tetanus, whooping cough, polio)







12-13 Years

 HPV vaccine — prevents cervical and other cancers







13-14 **Years**

- Td/IPV booster (3-in-1 teenage booster) helps protect against tetanus, diphtheria and polio.
- MenACWY protects against meningitis A, C, W, Y
